

Coaching Information – Division 1 and 2 Teams

Some important notes:

- Players must provide their own helmet which needs to be worn at ALL TIMES when the player is batting or running the bases.
- Parents are required to stay with their children for the duration of the game (not just drop them off and come back to pick them up at the end of the game).
- Players are required to use the provided hand sanitizer at the beginning and end of every game
- If a player is not batting they must stay behind the line of the backstop. This prevents injuries in case the batter accidentally lets go of the bat.
- The batter does not go up to the tee until the catcher has placed the ball onto the tee.
- Parents are expected to be in the field with their player when they are batting or fielding.
- Back catcher must wear their batting helmet.
- Parents should space their chairs 6 ft apart
- Adults are encouraged to wear face masks

How to run the game:

- Home team is in field first, Away team bats first.
- Play as many innings as you can during your time allotted.
- Starting the game – we encourage the coach and all players to gather in a circle, hands together in the middle, and cheer – *Go Team Name!*

Batting

- Each coach is provided with a binder which contains a batting order for each.
- Each player is required to wear a helmet while batting and running the bases.
- First batter hits the ball off the Tee and runs to first base. Only one base at a time.
- After the batter the coach uses a Lysol wipe to wipe down the bat and ball.
- Second batter hits the ball off the Tee and runs to first base. The player on first base runs to second base.
- After the batter the coach uses a Lysol wipe to wipe down the bat and ball.
- Third batter hits the ball off the Tee and runs to first base. The player on second base runs to third base and the player on first base runs to second base.
- After the batter the coach uses a Lysol wipe to wipe down the bat and ball.
- This continues until the last batter.
- Last batter hits an automatic home run. The coach should announce – LAST BATTER – so that everyone knows. The batter hits the ball and runs all the bases – thus getting the home run.
- This ends this half of the inning.
- Players and the coach (and parents) return to the bench and get ready for fielding.

Fielding

- Each coach is provided with a binder which contains the field placement. Every player is assigned a fielding position which changes every inning.
- Players assigned to 1st base, 2nd base, 3rd base and short stop should stand 6ft behind the base (behind the base line for short stop). The back catcher should stand back from the tee and batter (closer to the backstop). This is to accomplish as much physical distancing as possible while playing the game.
- In order to ‘play fair’ and to ensure all players have a turn fielding the ball, the following method seems to work.

- When the ball is hit off the Tee, the coach will point to the player on second base to field the ball. The player on second base picks up the ball and throws the ball to the player on first base. The player on first base throws the ball to the catcher who places the ball on the Tee, ready for the next batter.
- When the next batter hits the ball off the Tee, the coach will point to the player at short stop to field the ball. The player at short stop picks up the ball and throws the ball to the player on first base. The player on first base throws the ball to the catcher who places the ball on the Tee ready for the next batter.
- This continues – with the coach pointing to the fielders, one at a time, who pick up the ball and throw it to first base. **This way, every player has an opportunity to field the ball at least once, during the inning. It also prevents ‘swarming’ which is – when the ball is hit, the tendency is for all players to run to field the ball. Fingers can be stepped on, heads butt – and there are tears. This prevents all of that. Please encourage your player to only ‘make the play’ if the coach indicates it is his/her turn.**
- The player on first base and the catcher are engaged in every play. This gives these two players an opportunity to hone their catching and throwing skills.
- Players and the coach (and parents) return to the bench, get ready for batting.
